

Labour Force Survey, July 2026

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in The Daily, Friday, August 7, 2026

Highlights

Employment increased by 75,000 (+0.4%) in July and the employment rate rose 0.1 percentage points to 60.9%. The unemployment rate declined 0.1 percentage points to 6.4%.

Employment rose among core-aged people (25 to 54 years old) (+51,000; +0.4%), mostly for women in that age group (+33,000; +0.5%).

The unemployment rate for core-aged women fell 0.3 percentage points to 5.2%, while it held steady for core-aged men (5.8%), youth (12.6%), and people aged 55 and older (5.2%).

Employment increased in wholesale and retail trade (+21,000; +0.7%); finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (+18,000; +1.2%); professional, scientific and technical services (+17,000; +0.8%); as well as in construction (+16,000; +1.0%). In contrast, employment declined in public administration (-15,000; -1.2%) and agriculture (-9,600; -4.3%).

There were more people working in Ontario (+52,000; +0.6%), British Columbia (+18,000; +0.6%), Manitoba (+5,900; +0.8%), and Nova Scotia (+4,600; +0.9%).

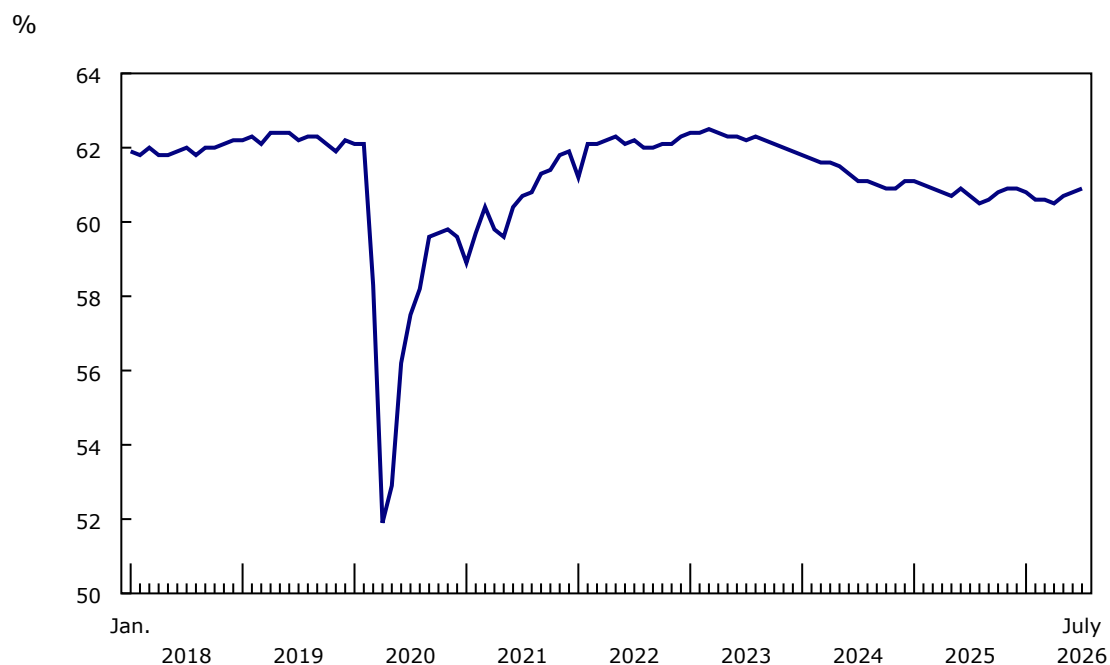
Average hourly wages among employees were up 2.8% (+\$1.01 to \$37.17) on a year-over-year basis in July, following growth of 3.3% in June (not seasonally adjusted).

Employment rises in July

Employment increased by 75,000 (+0.4%) in July, with gains split between full-time and part-time work. Since April, total employment was up by 181,000 (+0.9%), driven by a rise in full-time work (+193,000; +1.1%).

The employment rate—the proportion of the population aged 15 and older who are employed—increased by 0.1 percentage points to 60.9% in July. The rate was up 0.2 percentage points compared with 12 months earlier.

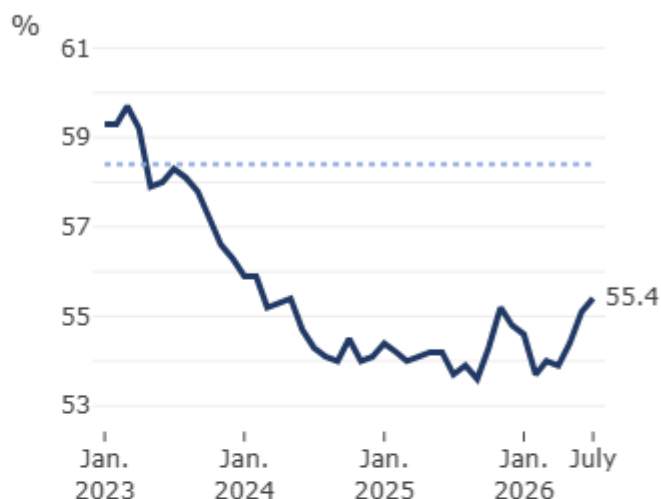
Infographic 1 – Employment rate by age group, July 2026

 - - - - 2017 to 2019 average

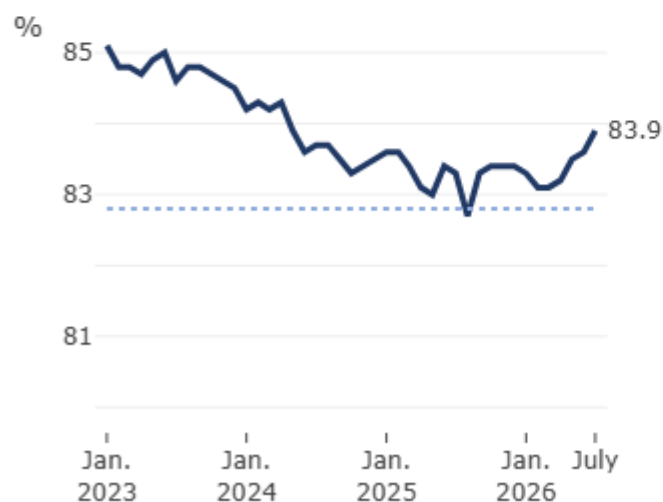
Total (15 years and older)

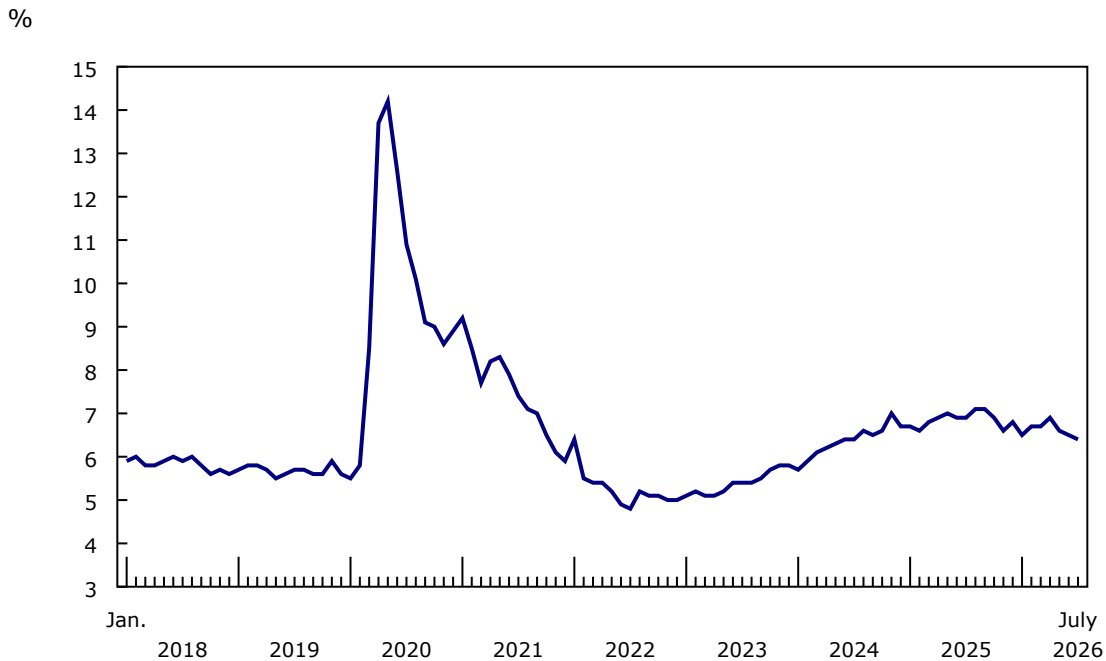
In July, the number of private sector employees rose (+58,000; +0.4%), as did the number of self-employed workers (+44,000; +1.6%). These gains were partially offset by a decline in the number of public sector employees (-27,000; -0.6%). Since April, employment growth has been concentrated among private sector employees (+146,000; +1.1%) and self-employed workers (+73,000; +2.7%).

Unemployment rate decreases to 6.4%, lowest level in two years

In July, the unemployment rate decreased 0.1 percentage points to 6.4%. This was the lowest rate since July 2024.

This marked the third consecutive monthly decrease for the unemployment rate, which has fallen by 0.5 percentage points since April. The rate was also down 0.5 percentage points on a year-over-year basis in July.

A higher proportion of people searching for work have been finding jobs compared with last year. The job finding rate—the proportion of unemployed people who found a job between June and July—was 20.8%. This was up from 18.5% for the same period a year earlier but below the pre-COVID-19 pandemic average of 26.6% recorded for the same period from 2017 to 2019 (not seasonally adjusted).

Unemployment rate falls for core-aged women

Among core-aged women (25 to 54 years old), the unemployment rate fell 0.3 percentage points to 5.2% in July, coinciding with an increase in employment for this group (+33,000; +0.5%). For core-aged men, the unemployment rate was little changed at 5.8% and employment edged up (+18,000; +0.2%).

The employment rate for core-aged women rose 0.4 percentage points to 81.2% in July and was up 1.1 percentage points on a year-over-year basis. The employment rate for this group in July was higher than the corresponding pre-pandemic average of 79.1%, observed from 2017 to 2019. For core-aged men, the employment rate was 86.5% in July, little changed from the previous month and on a year-over-year basis and virtually the same as the pre-pandemic average of 86.4%.

For people aged 55 and older, the unemployment rate was 5.2%, little changed in July and compared with 12 months earlier. The employment rate for people in this age group was little changed in July at 33.4%.

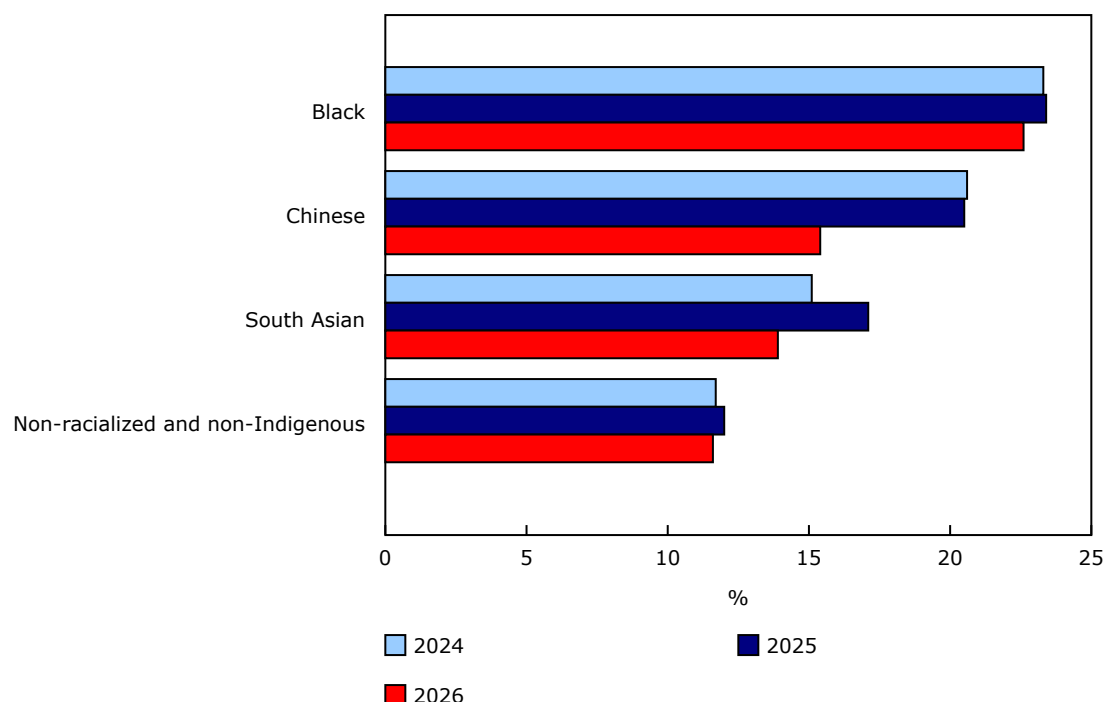
Youth unemployment rate holds steady in July

The unemployment rate for youth (15 to 24 years old) was virtually unchanged in July (-0.1 percentage points to 12.6%) and was down from a recent peak of 14.3% in April. On a year-over-year basis, the youth unemployment rate was down 1.9 percentage points in July. The youth unemployment rate in July remained higher than the pre-pandemic average of 10.8% from 2017 to 2019.

Although the overall youth unemployment rate has recorded declines in recent months, it remains elevated for certain population groups. Among the three largest racialized groups in Canada, the unemployment rate was highest among Black youth, at 22.6% in July 2026, little changed from 23.4% in July 2025 and 23.3% in July 2024 (three-month moving averages, not seasonally adjusted). Compared with July 2025, the unemployment rate among Chinese youth declined by 5.1 percentage points to 15.4% in July 2026, while the rate among South Asian youth fell by 3.2 percentage points to 13.9%.

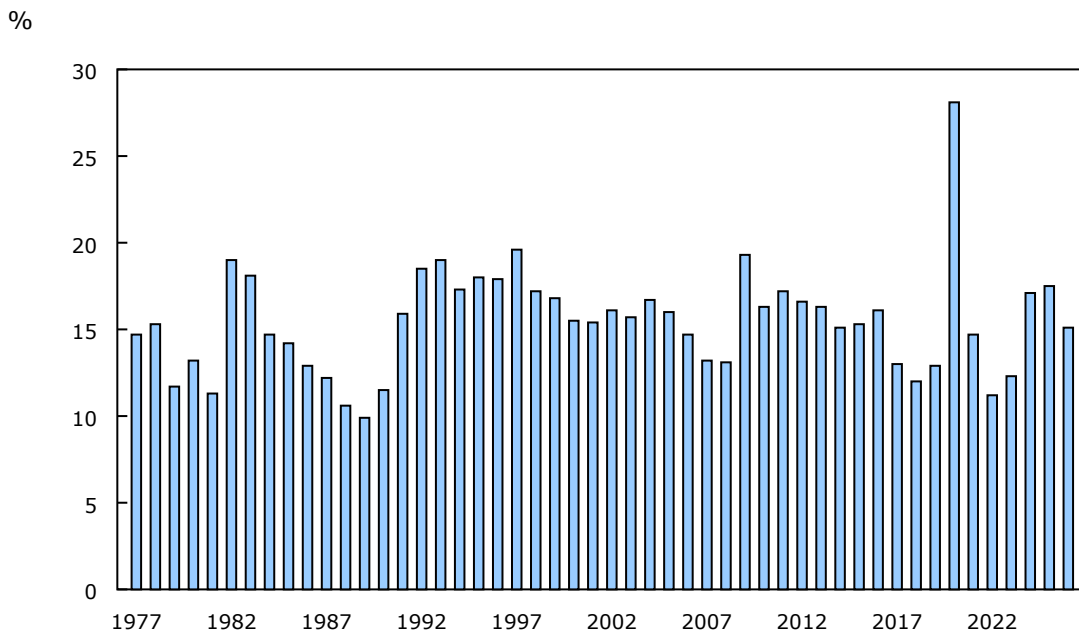

More favourable summer job market for returning students in 2026 compared with 2025

From May to August, the Labour Force Survey (LFS) collects labour market information about students who attended school full time in March and who intend to return to school full time in the fall.

The unemployment rate for returning students aged 15 to 24 was 15.1% in July, down 2.4 percentage points from July 2025 (17.5%) (not seasonally adjusted). The rate in July 2026 remained higher than the pre-pandemic average of 12.6% for the same month from 2017 to 2019.

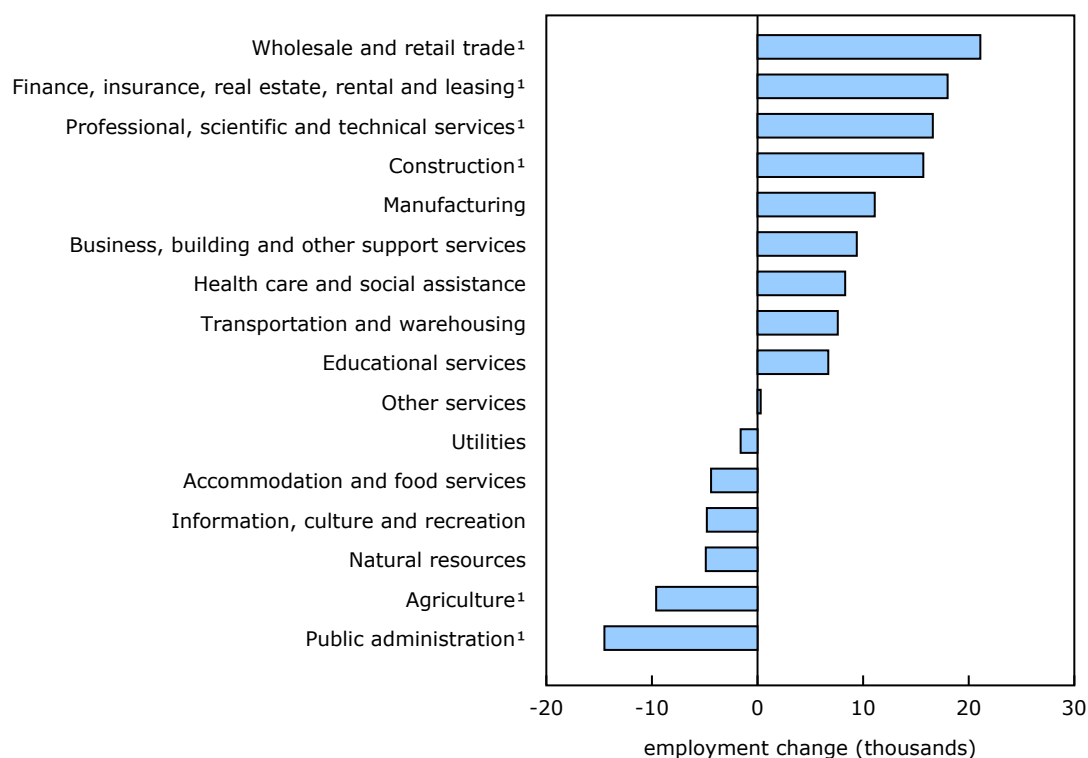
For returning students aged 20 to 24—those most likely to be in post-secondary education—the unemployment rate was 6.3% in July, the lowest rate for this group since July 2018. Meanwhile, for returning students aged 15 to 16, the rate was 28.5% in July, compared with 31.4% observed in July 2025 and July 2024. The rate for returning students aged 17 to 19 was 17.6% in July 2026, little changed compared with 12 months earlier.

Among returning students aged 15 to 24 who were employed in July, most worked in retail trade (24.8%), accommodation and food services (22.0%) and information, culture and recreation (14.5%). For those who were employees, their average weekly wages were \$523.05, up 2.9% compared with 12 months earlier.

Employment grows in several industries, led by wholesale and retail trade

Wholesale and retail trade (+21,000; +0.7%) recorded the largest employment increase across industries in July. Despite the monthly increase, employment in this industry was down by 50,000 (-1.7%) compared with 12 months earlier, largely reflecting a downward trend observed from January to May 2026.

1. Change is statistically significant.

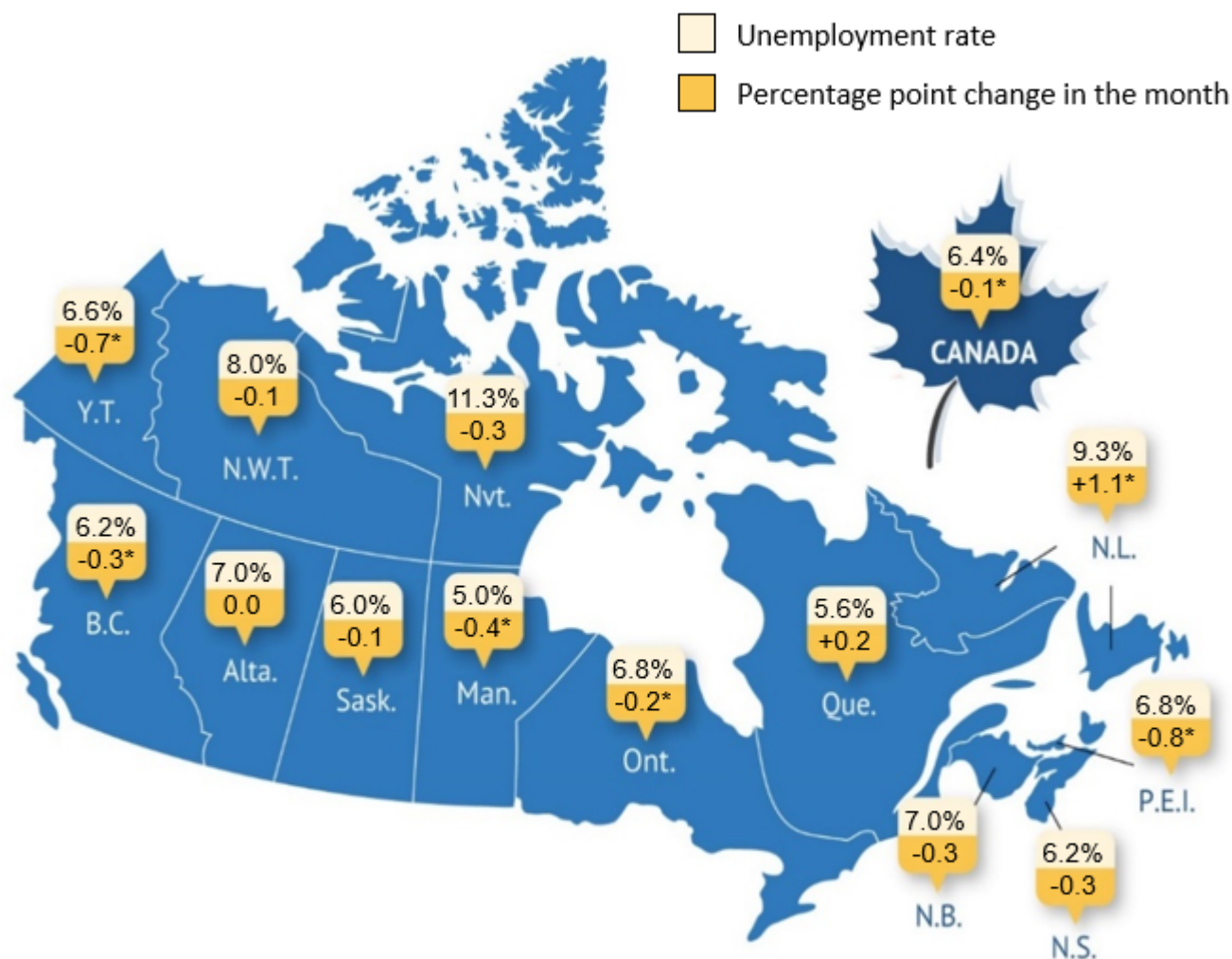

Employment also rose in July in finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (+18,000; +1.2%), professional, scientific and technical services (+17,000; +0.8%) and construction (+16,000; +1.0%). Despite recording monthly gains, employment in these three industries was little changed on a year-over-year basis.

Employment gains concentrated in Ontario

Employment in Ontario increased by 52,000 (+0.6%) in July, the third increase in four months with a net gain of 119,000 (+1.5%) over this period. The unemployment rate in Ontario declined 0.2 percentage points to 6.8% in July. The rate was down from a recent high of 7.9% in December 2025 and was the lowest rate for this province since July 2024.

Employment in British Columbia was up by 18,000 (+0.6%) in July, continuing an upward trend since May. The unemployment rate in British Columbia (6.2%) was down for the second consecutive month in July from a recent high of 6.8% in May 2026.

Employment rose in Manitoba (+5,900; +0.8%) in July, the first monthly increase since March. The unemployment rate in the province was down 0.4 percentage points to 5.0% in July, matching the rate in April.

In Nova Scotia, employment increased by 4,600 (+0.9%) in July, the second consecutive monthly increase. Year over year, employment in this province was up by 12,000 (+2.4%). The unemployment rate in Nova Scotia was 6.2%, little changed in the month but down 0.7 percentage points compared with 12 months earlier.

Employment in Quebec was little changed both in July and compared with 12 months earlier and the unemployment rate was also little changed at 5.6% over the same periods.

In Alberta, employment was little changed in July but was up by 91,000 (+3.5%) on a year-over-year basis, the largest proportional increase among the provinces. The unemployment rate in Alberta held steady at 7.0% in July and was down 0.9 percentage points compared with the same month in 2025.

Among the three largest census metropolitan areas, the unemployment rate rose by 0.7 percentage points to 6.6% in Montréal, offsetting a similar-sized decline in the previous month. In Vancouver, the unemployment rate fell 0.6 percentage points to 6.0% in July. The unemployment rate was little changed in Toronto at 6.7%; however, it was down from a recent high of 9.0% observed in July 2025.

Sustainable Development Goals

On January 1, 2016, the world officially began implementation of the [2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development](#)—the United Nations' transformative plan of action that addresses urgent global challenges over the next 15 years. The plan is based on 17 specific sustainable development goals.

The Labour Force Survey is an example of how Statistics Canada supports the reporting on the Global Goals for Sustainable Development. This release will be used in helping to measure the following goals:



Note to readers

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates for July reflect labour market conditions during the reference week of July 12 to 18, 2026.

The sample size of the LFS is approximately 65,000 households, representing over 100,000 respondents each month. For more information, see the [Guide to the Labour Force Survey](#).

This analysis focuses on differences between estimates that are statistically significant at the 68% confidence level. Monthly estimates may show more sampling variability than trends observed over longer periods. For more information, see "[Interpreting Monthly Changes in Employment from the Labour Force Survey](#)."

LFS estimates at the Canada level do not include the territories.

The LFS estimates are the first in a series of labour market indicators released by Statistics Canada, which includes indicators from programs such as the Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours (SEPH); Employment Insurance Statistics; and the Job Vacancy and Wage Survey. The **employment rate** is the number of employed people as a percentage of the population aged 15 years and older. The rate for a particular group (for example, youth aged 15 to 24 years) is the number employed in that group as a percentage of the population for that group.

The **unemployment rate** is the number of unemployed people as a percentage of the labour force (employed and unemployed).

The **participation rate** is the number of employed and unemployed people as a percentage of the population aged 15 years and older.

Full-time employment consists of persons who usually work 30 hours or more per week at their main or only job.

Part-time employment consists of persons who usually work less than 30 hours per week at their main or only job.

Total hours worked refers to the number of hours actually worked at the main job by the respondent during the reference week, including paid and unpaid hours. These hours reflect temporary decreases or increases in work hours (for example, hours lost due to illness, vacation, holidays or weather; or more hours worked due to overtime).

This release refers to the [gender of a person](#). The category "men" includes men, as well as some non-binary persons. The category "women" includes women, as well as some non-binary persons. Given that the non-binary population is small, data aggregation to a two-category gender variable is necessary to protect the confidentiality of responses provided.

Seasonal adjustment

Unless otherwise stated, estimates presented in this release are seasonally adjusted, which facilitates comparisons by removing the effects of typical seasonal variations. For more information on seasonal adjustment, see [Seasonally adjusted data: Concepts and interpretation](#).

Population totals in the Labour Force Survey

The LFS target population includes all persons aged 15 years and older whose usual place of residence is in Canada, with some exceptions (those living on reserves, full-time members of the regular Armed Forces and persons living in institutions). The target population includes temporary residents—that is, those with a valid work or study permit, their families, and refugee claimants—as well as permanent residents (landed immigrants) and the Canadian-born.

Information gathered from LFS respondents is weighted to represent the survey target population using population calibration totals. These totals are updated each month, using the most recently available information on population changes derived from Canada's official population estimates, with minor adjustments being made to reflect the LFS target population.

While the LFS population totals are generally aligned with official demographic estimates, the official estimates should be considered the official measure of population change in Canada.
